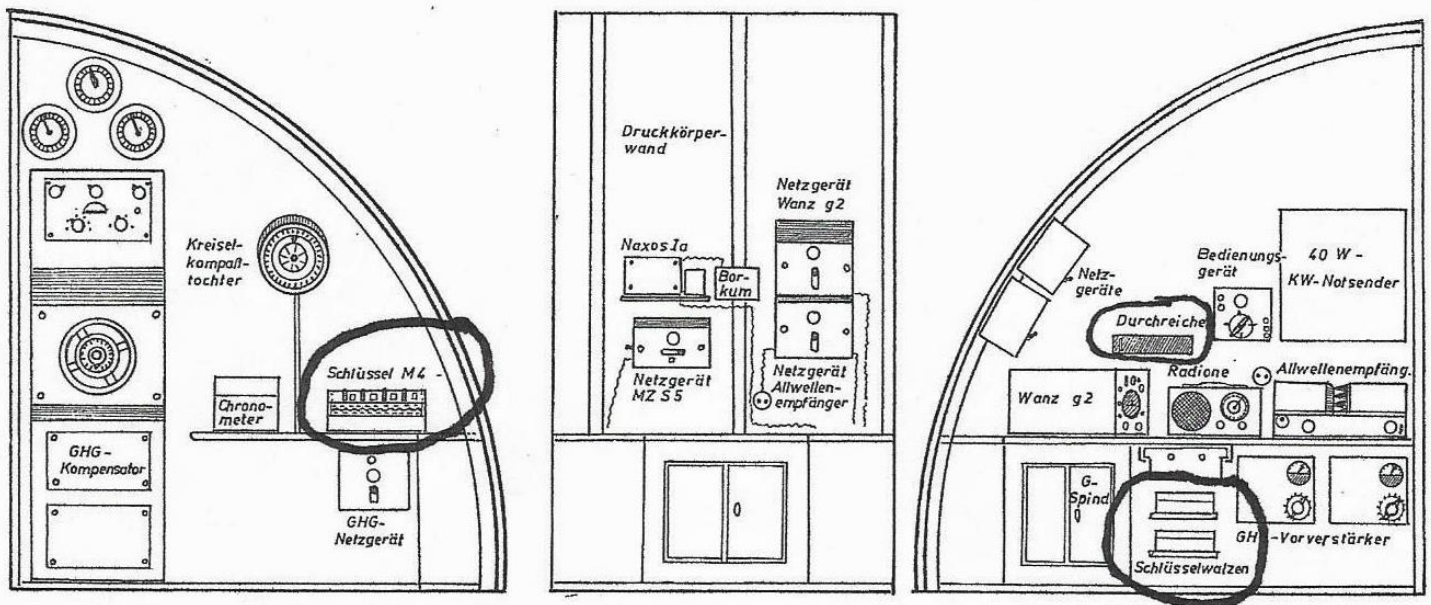


Hello to all of my Enigma World Code Group friends,

One of our long-time members, Franz von Habsburg, sent me an interesting email the other week. Enigma research is really fun! Do you remember the September/October Newsletter? I included a line drawing of a Type VII C 1944 Listening/Sound Room. In the Listening/Sound Room, I circled the 4-rotor M4 Enigma machine (which was shown in the Listening/Sound Room, not the Radio Room) and two "Schlüsselwalzen," the boxes used to carry the extra Enigma rotors not in use.

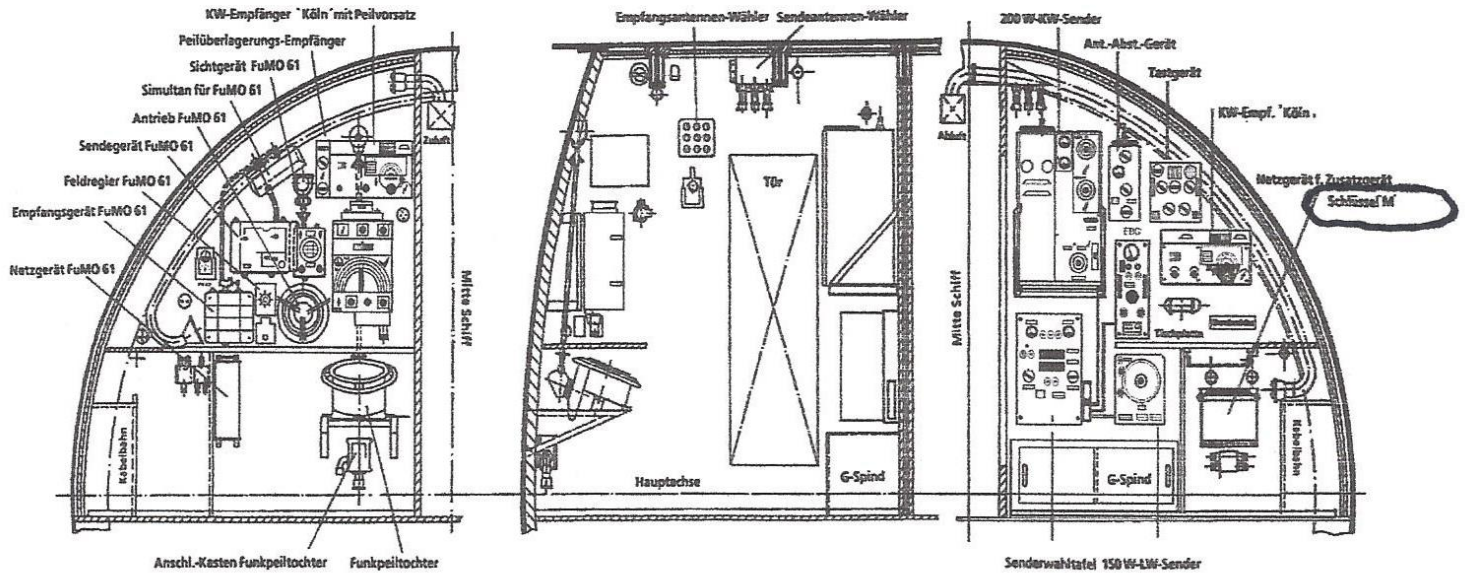


Einrichtung des Horchraums von U 231 (Typ VII C) Anfang 1944

I reasoned that because there were two Schlüsselwalzen, therefore there must be two Enigma machines on board the U-boat. But in researching another matter, I came upon an equipment list and a line drawing, here again, supposedly for a Type VII C 1944 U-boat, this time showing the Radio Room. And guess what's listed in the Radio Room? Right, the Enigma machine! (The line is not pointing to the Enigma machine. The line is pointing at the "Netzgerate fur Zusatzgerat" [power supplies for additional equipment] printed right above the word "Schlüssel 'M'" [Cypher Machine M = Enigma]. Presumably the Enigma machine is down there somewhere. It is not drawn-in!)

And even better, the equipment list shows that two Schlüsselwalzen "Transit cases for code drums" come as standard equipment for each (singular!) Enigma machine.
